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	 The maximum number of children permitted per site is 24. However, multiple groups of 24 are permitted if they can be segregated to prevent contact throughout the day with other groups. Students should be invited to schools during scheduled times at least once per week after re-entry plans have been finalized, and provided that operational and public health requirements can be met. Participating in any in-person activities will be optional for student and families. Student transportation is not a requirement in this plan, however, school divisions may assess reinstating bus routes based on local needs.
